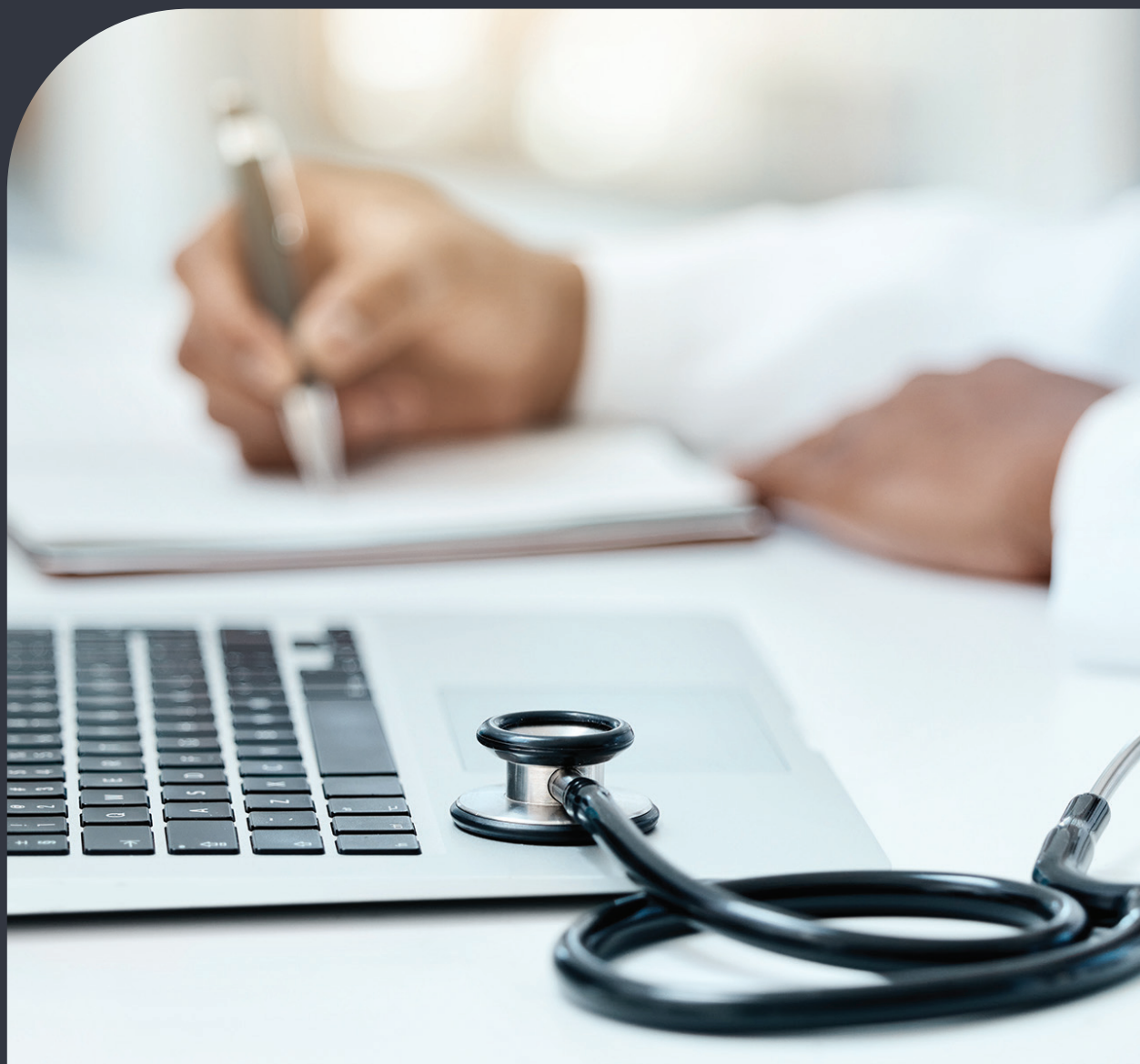

Vandalia Health, headquartered in Charleston, is a multi-state health system with locations across West Virginia as well as in Maryland, Ohio, Pennsylvania and Virginia. Made up of CAMC Health System, Davis Health System and Mon Health System.

Vandalia Health has 17 hospitals (including three affiliates)

The only kidney transplant center in southern West Virginia

The first freestanding women and children's hospital in West Virginia (featuring 30+ pediatric specialties)

Level I Trauma Center (highest ranking)

Level I pediatric intensive care unit (highest ranking)

Level III neonatal intensive care unit (with the most critical NICU resources)

CAMC Institute for Academic Medicine

- Provides education, outreach and research support to student physicians and other medical professionals in programs leading to degrees or certifications in health professions.
- Is the only hospital-based provider of continuing medical education in West Virginia that is nationally accredited.
- Is accredited by the Association for the Accreditation of Human Research Protection Programs, signifying excellence in protecting human research participants.
- Provides education, outreach and research support to student physicians and other medical professionals. The institute operates 20 graduate medical education, three pharmacy residency programs and two clinical psychology internships.

As a major academic medical center, Vandalia Health supports:

- Over 1,000 learners in its facilities daily
- 247 interns, residents and fellows
- 74 West Virginia University School of Medicine medical students
- 108 West Virginia School of Osteopathic Medicine students
- 87 students enrolled in the CAMC School of Anesthesia (affiliated with University of Charleston)
- Clinical education experiences to more than 1,300 learners through 122 educational affiliated programs with WV and regional colleges and universities
- 34% of graduates establish practice/continue training in West Virginia (10-year average)
- 1,268 continuing education programs with 35,521 hours of credit issued

- 199 investigator-initiated studies
